


The Land of Persia

Cyrus the Great

- The Medes ruled Persia until a brilliant, powerful king named Cyrus took control.
- He became known as Cyrus the Great.
- Cyrus had a vision of conquering lands around Persia and uniting the lands into one large empire.
- Between 550 BCE and 539 BCE he had conquered most of the Fertile Crescent.

Cyrus ruled almost completely opposite of the way Assyrians ruled. He set up a policy of toleration. What do you think toleration means?



- After Cyrus died, a weak less-tolerant ruler faced rebellions in the empire.
- Then a strong leader named Darius came to power.
- After Darius put down those revolts, he moved to expand the empire of Persia.
- It grew to 2,800 miles. (Distance from New York city to Los Angeles)






Reign: 522 BC - 486 BC
