
Gods and Goddesses of Egypt








Did you know that the Egyptians worshipped more than 2000 gods and goddesses?






This is Isis, an awesome goddess with brilliant magical powers.

She is the wife of Osiris and the mother of Horus.

Fact File: Isis

Looks:

She is a beautiful woman who sometimes appears as a snake.

Cool Item:

Her head-dress is a vulture, with the throne of Egypt on top of her head.

Magical Powers:

She can heal people who are sick. She even healed her husband when he was dead!







This is Osiris, a mummified god. (He looks just like me!)

Fact File: Osiris

Looks:

He looks like a bandaged mummy with a green face.

Cool Item:

He holds a hooked stick, called a crook, and a whip, called a flail. The Egyptian kings copied his accessories.

Magical Powers:

He was murdered by his brother, but came back to life!

This is Horus, the sky god.

He is the son of Isis and Osiris.

Fact File: Horus

Looks:

He can look like a man with a hawk (bird) head. Sometimes he can be a whole hawk.

He doesn't have a cool item, poor Horus!

Magical Powers:

Flying in the sky above Egypt.

Poor Horus doesn't have a cool item. Think of a cool item to give to Horus and draw it on the next page.




Draw It

Looks:

He looks like an aardvark with donkey ears. Interestingly, there are no aardvarks in Egypt.

Cool Item:

He carries a big stick, which he can use to hit people.

Magical Powers:

He has super-human strength.








This is Hathor, a gentle goddess who can magically transform into a fierce lioness.

Fact File: Hathor

Looks:

She can look like a woman with cow's ears, or a woman with a cow's head. Sometimes she is pictured as a whole cow.

Cool Item:

Her crown is a sun disk and cow horns.

Magical Powers:

She can transform into the goddess Sekhmet, who is on the next page.

Scarab Rating: (I love her)







Look what happens to Hathor when she gets angry: she becomes Sekhmet, the lioness.

> She really scares me!

Fact File: Sekhmet

Looks:

She is a lioness with a woman's body.

Cool Item:

She has a mane, even though real lionesses don't.

Magical Powers:

She brings plagues (sickness) and death to the enemies of Egypt.





This is Ammit, a fierce creature who lives in the land of the dead.

I really don't want to meet her!

Fact File: Ammit

Looks:

She has the head of a crocodile, the front legs of a lion and the back legs of a hippopotamus.

Cool Item:

She is made up of three scary animals, so she doesn't need a cool item.

Magical Powers:

She eats people who have lived a bad life.

They're afraid they'll relax and unwind!




Now it's your turn.

He has a magical potter's wheel.


Magical Powers:
