

Problems with the Catholic Church

- The Church owned one-fifth to one-third of all the land in Europe.
- Critics were angry with how the church spent it's money. (indulgences)
- Many Europeans disliked paying taxes to the Church in Rome.
- Peasants' revolted for more rights in the 1500's.


WEAKENING CHURCH POWER

The Reformation



Factors eroding Church power:

- Discomfort with the wealth of the Church.
- Renaissance focus on secular and individual ideas.
- Gutenberg's printing press rapidly spreading ideas in vernacular.
- Germany divided into many competing states where papal authority was weak.





LUTHER'S TEACHINGS

The Reformation




- People cannot earn salvation through good works, only by faith in G-d's forgiveness of sins.
- The idea and authority of a pope or the church are invalid because they are not found in the Bible.
- * All people of faith are equal, so priests are not needed to interpret the Bible.
- Luther was also extremely anti-Semitic.

The Reformation




- Many German peasants liked Luther's ideas and rebelled against serfdom.
- Many German princes supported Luther in order to weaken the Catholic church and take its land. They signed a protest against the Church, and became known as Protestants.
- Catholic princes, led by Charles V, started a war to reclaim Church power and lands.
 - Over 100,000 people were killed, but the Protestants did not become Catholic.

HENRY VIII

The Reformation



- Henry VIII, King of England, needed a male heir.
- His first wife only had a girl, so he asked the pope to let him divorce her, and the pope refused.
- Henry set up his own church, Anglican, with himself as leader, and the same doctrines as Catholics, except for allowing divorces.
- Henry marries a total of six times, fathering only one son.









TUDOR MONARCHS

The Reformation




- Edward VI was nine when his father Henry VIII died in 1547, so adults ruled for him. He was often sick, and died six years later.
- Henry VIII's oldest daughter, Mary, became queen after her brother.
- She made England Catholic again, and executed many Anglicans, earning the nickname "Bloody Mary".
- Mary's younger sister, Elizabeth I, became queen in 1558, restored the Anglican church, and reigned for the next 44 years.

Humanism and secularism led people to question the Church.

Political

Powerful monarchs challenged the Church as the supreme power in Europe.

Many leaders viewed the pope as a foreign ruler, and challenged his authority.

Economic

European princes and kings were jealous of the Church's wealth.

Merchants and others resented having to pay taxes to the Church.

Religious

Some church leaders became corrupt.

Many people found Church practices such as the sale of indulgences unacceptable.
